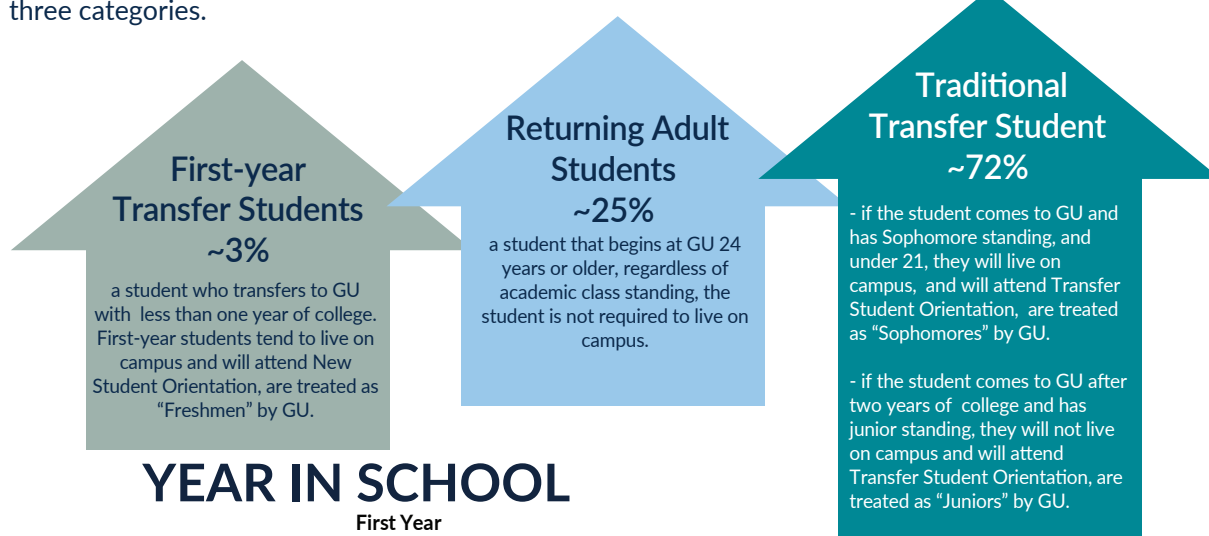

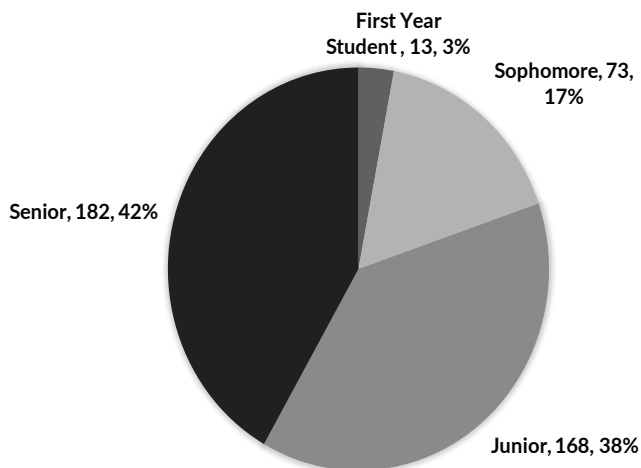

TRANSFER ADMISSIONS & DEFINITIONS

Any student that applies to GU after graduating from high school is processed as a transfer student. Because of this, all military veterans will be considered transfer students. GU groups transfers into three categories.

Housing requirements: Transfer students, are required to live on-campus for four semesters, or until you are the age of 21.

Military-Veterans Housing: The vast majority of military veterans will come to GU older than 21 and therefore will not live on campus.

Limited Housing: There is limited available housing for Juniors and Seniors or students older than 21.

Many transfer students receive scholarships and funding from GU. The two most common are the Transfer Merit Scholarship and the Transfer Opportunity Scholarship. Both the transfer merit, and transfer opportunity scholarships are awarded for two years. However, if it will take students longer than two years to complete their degree – they are eligible to apply for an extension. It is very common for people to take longer than two years to complete their degrees, and the odds of having scholarships extended are good. Aid extension paperwork can be found on the Financial Aid website, or stop by the Financial Aid Office for help.
